

School Program Fieldtrip Information

Thank you for scheduling an education program with Audubon Vermont at the Green Mountain Audubon Center. We are looking forward to sharing this wonderful place with your students. Below is information on logistics, procedures, and considerations for your visit. Please distribute this information to all participating teachers/classrooms.

Program details

You should receive an email confirming the details of your fieldtrip (i.e. date, time, program, number of students, meeting place etc.) 2-4 weeks prior to your fieldtrip. If you have not received this email or have any questions about these details, please call the Education Manager at 434-3068 or email <u>darcher@audubon.org</u>.

Chaperones

Please bring one adult chaperone for every 10 students. We greatly value chaperone enthusiasm and involvement in order to make this a memorable experience for your students. On our website, you will find a letter to chaperones outlining their responsibilities during the program. Teacher Role

We encourage you to use the time during the program to observe, assist, and/or assess your students. We would like this to be a learning experience for you, as well as your students, and encourage your participation throughout the trip. You may wish to discuss the role you would like to take during the trip with the Audubon Teacher/Naturalist(s) upon your arrival.

Nametags

Please provide visible nametags for students and adults so that we can call them by name.

Dressing for Learning Outdoors

We often spend the entire program outdoors. It is extremely important that everyone comes properly dressed. In the spring and fall, please stress that students and chaperones should wear or bring a waterproof rain jacket, an extra warm layer, comfortable walking shoes, and a hat with a brim. We recommend that everyone wear long pants due to the presence of ticks during these seasons. In the winter, everyone should wear or bring snow pants, a winter jackets or snowsuit, lined boots, heavy socks, hats, mittens or gloves, and scarves. Please check the forecast before your trip and consider that the weather at the Center could be very different from the conditions at your school.

Students with Special Needs

Notify us in advance about students with physical limitations, severe allergies to insects, or any other special needs that we should know about.

If you have questions or concerns regarding your payment, please contact the Education Manager prior to your visit. Your program fee may be given to the staff member who greets you on the day of your program or you may mail it in advance. Please pay with a single check made out to *Audubon Vermont* or with cash and be sure to include your Program Payment Form with your payment.

Restrooms

Our programs are outdoors and students will be hiking in areas away from where restrooms readily available. We advise that students use the restrooms at school before coming to the Audubon Center. There are outhouses located near the Sugarhouse, not far from our initial meeting place in the field. Restrooms are also available in the office building on Sherman Hollow Rd. Please ask an Audubon staff member to point you in the direction of the nearest facilities during your program if the need arises.

Picnic Lunches

Full day programs include a half hour break for lunch. If you are participating in a half day morning or afternoon program, you are welcome to arrive early or remain after your program to eat a picnic lunch. Picnic tables are located in the field near the Sugarhouse and in the yard next to our office building. In the event of rain (if scheduling permits), we have some benches in our Clubhouse, located near the Sugarhouse. This is not a heated facility, but can be used to stay dry. If rain is forecasted for the day of your program, please check with the Education Programs Coordinator about the availability of the Clubhouse on the morning of your program. Please be sure to bring trash bags to carry out any garbage.

Inclement Weather

In the case of inclement weather you may choose to 1) try to reschedule your program; 2) come for the program if your students and chaperones are dressed appropriately for the weather; or 3) you may cancel your trip. If the weather is questionable, please **email** the Audubon Education Manager the day before your trip to speak with us about your trip.
