White Pine Tree

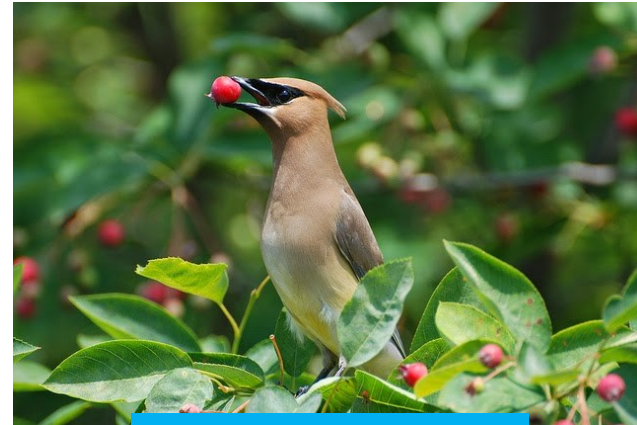


Hairy Woodpecker

Oak trees host 557 species of caterpillars, which nourish birds during nesting season.



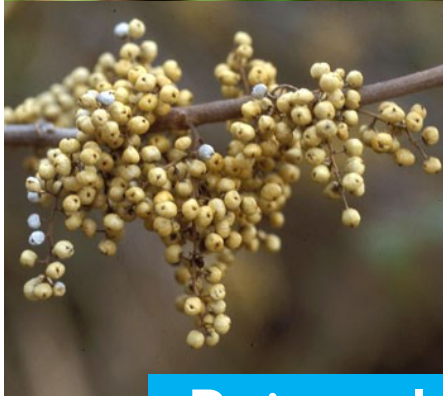
Birch Tree



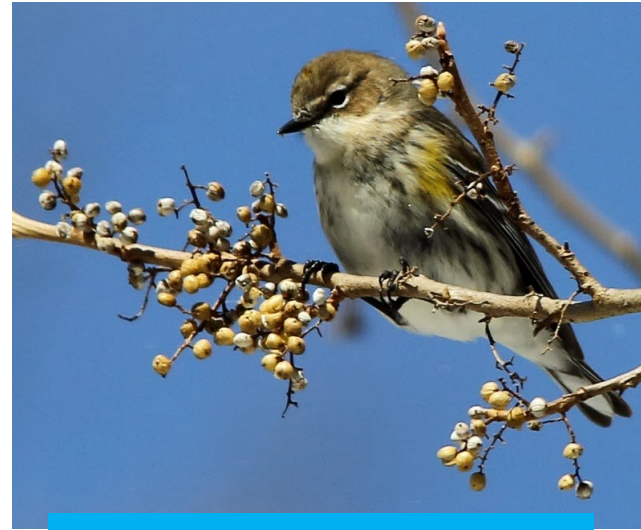
White-breasted Nuthatch
