These forest blocks were identified in 2012 by the National Audubon Society's Eastern Forests Project as the largest, most intact forested areas that support the highest richness and abundance of birds of regional conservation responsibility in Vermont as part of the US portion (Florida to Maine) of the Atlantic Flyway. The A1 block supports breeding populations of Bicknell's Thrush, a Species of Global Conservation Concern. The B3 blocks are candidates for designation as Important Bird Areas under BirdLife International's Biome-restricted Species Assemblages criterion. Collectively, the blocks serve as the focal areas for Audubon Vermont's Forest Bird Initiative conservation efforts.
